Published data suggests that the number of corporate venture investors has tripled over the course of the past five years with ¾ of Fortune 100 companies participating in venture capital financing rounds in 2017. And yet corporate venture capital is unique from other more traditional forms of venture capital in that corporate venture investors commonly strive to advance both strategic and financial objectives when making investments in startup companies.
